Baretta



Baretta is a 34-year-old Registered Quarter Horse gelding we rescued nine years ago. He raced when he was young, and belonged to "Miss Cheyenne Frontier Days" in the

prime of his life. He had a career as a National level barrel racer into his teens. He changed hands when he was about 24 years old, and

became a family horse. Poor care, lack of knowledge, bad teeth and

his age left him extremely thin and in poor health. After his adoption, recovery took nearly a year. With his strength and spirit back, he became a 4-H project and was shown English and Western pleasure for several more years. He is retired now and roams freely on 40 acres. Weight is always an issue with him, as he has only about two molars that don't appose. We feed him soaked beet pulp, senior, wheat and rice bran four times a day, along with whatever hay and grass he can eat.



Shoni



Shoni is a 35-year-old Appaloosa gelding that has been with us for the past 24 years. He has taught many adults and children to ride and has done everything from parades to rodeo to jumping in Pony Club. He was retired only four years ago, and seems to enjoy the easy life. He tends to be an "easy keeper" and is

in charge of the herd. He has a few missing teeth, so can't chew hay properly anymore. Because of this, we have had problems with him having episodes of colic, usually impaction colic. We feed him soaked beet pulp, senior and wheat bran four times a day to keep moisture in his diet.

The transformation that our geldings have undergone since they have been on **Equus Advance** and **Equus Ultimate** is amazing. For the first two months, the geldings were using **Equus Advance**. Then Baretta was switched to **Equus Ultimate** while Shoni stayed on **Equus Advance**. There was a noticeable change in Baretta; he gained 235 pounds in six months. This weight gain is amazing because we never changed his feeding program with the exception of adding **Equus Advance** and **Equus Ultimate**. Shoni continued doing well on **Equus Advance** and has not had any problems with impaction colic. They have started running and playing a lot more. They definitely have more energy and feel better with the Equus products.
